

Report on release of Baha annual magazine, published by Binapani Ashram:

The annual magazine, Baha, a Binapani Ashram publication, was released at Boi-Chitra exhibition hall on the second floor of College Street Coffee House on 23rd July, 2015 at 6pm. Dr.S.Bhattacharya, Publisher of Baha and Chairman of Binapani Ashram explained the involvement of their institution in propagation and development of formal education for the tribal community and the underprivileged to the audience. He also discussed how the publication (Baha) enables the organisers to bring and connect a large number of educated people to come under the *umbrella* of Binapani Ashram. This creates an opportunity for the people to think for the poor & hapless, who dream to go to school. Four ashram girls, led by their mentor Smt. Manjusree Saren virtually mesmerised the audience through presentation of Tagore songs. The listeners applauded at the wonderful translation and rendering of Tagore songs in Santhali language. Sri Barka Saren, the founder settler of Binapani Ashram translated 25 Tagore songs in Santhali so far. The meeting ended with literary discussions by three eminent teachers from different universities.
